

Annotated Bibliography

An annotated bibliography is simply a list of sources you are considering, with brief notes for each source.

Your list should include an MLA formatted citation of each source (author, article title, publication title, date, etc). With each citation, write a two or three-sentence note, including what you might use this source for and a quick summary of the source's content. Please also include a link to your source if possible. {Please note—if you find a source through Proquest, the Proquest link will not allow me to see the source. Either attach a pdf copy of the source or find the proper “embed” code to share the source with me.}
